



Guidelines and Information about KidSchool - 2011

DROP OFF AND PICK UP

Children in Grades K-3 must be dropped off and picked up at the classroom by an adult. Grades 4 and 5 can get to their classes on their own, but ought to be picked up at the classroom at the end of the day. Grades 6 and 7 can go to class on their own and meet their parents or responsible adults in the lobby.

RESPECT FOR THE CLASSROOM AND THE BUILDING

Please remind your children that they may not use any materials in the classrooms, including the computers, which we know are a temptation. The teachers will convey this message as well. Likewise, children cannot run around the building or the social hall. Please help us monitor this situation together, even if your own child or children are not involved. It takes a village...

FOOD

Any food that is brought into SAJ must be kosher. All snacks that TCC KidSchool provides will comply with SAJ requirements.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

In order to have the most meaningful and focused classes, we ask that you not send children to KidSchool with any electronics or devices that can be distractions. For children who have a cell phone with them, please make sure they understand that it must be stored away and may not be used during class time as a phone, game or music device.

ATTENDANCE

Our teachers spend valuable time preparing for their classes and for your children. Please make sure you alert them and the school director when they will be arriving or leaving late or will be absent.

PARENT INVOLVEMENT

Please be sure to read the letters that the teachers will be sending you as follow-up to class sessions. These are written so that parents will feel more included in the on-going learning that takes place at KidSchool and can continue the conversation in your own home.

CLASSROOM MANAGEMENT

We recognize that KidSchool is voluntary and that kids sometimes give their parents a hard time about attending. Our goal is to engage all of the students in class and develop a respectful and cooperative teaching atmosphere. However, if a child is disruptive and distracts others from a positive learning experience, we will talk to parents about the best way to manage the situation including the possibility of inviting a parent into the classroom to assist the teacher.
